Minutes of the General Meeting April 1,2017

Minutes:. The minutes of the last meeting were approved as written.

Treasurer's Report: Marie Moore reported that our bank account remains in it's usual good shape and currently we have 121 members.

Old Business:

- Jim Moore reports the following for the Dixon Event. A.) The Dixon Fairgrounds announced we are no longer able to charge spectators a parking fee and only vendors can park their vehicles on fairgrounds property. Spectators will be directed to the "free" parking lot across the street from the main entrance. Currently looking for a uniformed person to guide spectator vehicles to the free lot. A large sign will be needed and placed to help direct spectator vehicles to the free lot. B.) A Janitorial services company has been selected. This service company comes highly recommended and has a good working relationship with the Fairgrounds. Good news is this service company will be on site both Friday and Saturday from 9:00 AM - 6:00 PM. C.) Food vendors for Dixon will include a coffee/donut vendor, Mexican food vendor, and a Hot dog vendor. Friday's banquet will be catered by Hannibal's Catering from Sacramento. This company comes highly recommended by John Markley who has used this company for many events in the past. Hannibal's will have one employee onsite to set-up and serve, along with complete clean up after the dinner. D.) Merchandising for the Dixon event will be handled by Chris Stuart - Thanks in advance Chris! E.) The large I80 Electronic sign will again advertise the event. Good news is the cost is only \$100 total. And, the sign rotates with only four advertisers 24/7. F.) Rich Ostrander reports the Dixon event will be advertised in various publications including, Motorcycle Classics Magazine, Cruisn' News, as well as other publications. G. The event T-shirt will be a "short sleeved only" and color is white with the logo on the reverse side. Note: This event is the Fort Sutter Club's 35th National Motorcycle Show and the 17th National Road Run.
- Rich Ostrander reported Fort Sutter has been invited to participate in this year's 10th Annual Downtown Ford Classic & Custom Car Show to be held on Saturday May 20th. Why are we discussing April Fools Day? Below you will see how we all were fooled......



Editor's Bench


