Minutes of the General Meeting October 3, 2015

The general consensus was for "100 Year Old" or "Century Bikes", probably using the wording Pre-16s in there somewhere. We'll have to figure it out by the end of December meeting as that is when the copy for the ad in the national magazine is due.

Nominations: Outgoing directors for this term will be Marie Moore, Richard Kinney, Tom Green, and Mark Wiebens. All outgoing directors were nominated to replace themselves. In addition, Gary Kubodera, John Markley, and Stan Randall were nominated to run for office bringing the total nominated to 7. Meeting adjourned at 1:43 p.m. **Update:** Tom Green states due to "health reasons" I will not be running for a board position this year.

Minutes of the Closed Board Meeting October 3, 2015

Pertaining to Changes at Dixon

- **We voted to**: Change the pre-registration fee for Dixon 2016 from \$45 to \$50 per vendor space, and registration at the gate to \$60 per vendor space.
- We voted to: Have a food vendor there on Thursday for the workers and the vendors. Possibly using them to provide the vendor meal that evening.
- We voted to: Continue the \$25 food vendor fee. Possibly having one vendor on the East side of the vendor field.
- We voted to: Honor John Schaefer on the 2016 Dixon Meet shirt.
- **We voted:** Continue the 'free to the vendor' dinner on Thursday night. Mark W. will check with Yerba Buena on splitting the cost up to a maximum of \$4 per meal for each chapter. The meal to be no more than a total of \$8.
- **We voted to:** Continue the janitorial service at Dixon 2016. We would ask they clean at 10AM and 4pm both Friday and Saturday.
- We voted to: Use the electronic sign on Hwy I80 using the same days and sides of sign used in 2015.
- **We voted to:** Give each vendor one pin regardless of the number of spaces rented, and one meal ticket per space rented.
- **We discussed** the use of the south lawn for vendor overflow and options we might have. Depending on what will be allowed by the fairground we will position the vendors in the best place for them to be seen and have buyers available to them.

Among the 30 bikes in their display (all pre-1978 models) are some British, German and Japanese makes as well as a good variety of American motorcycles including Harley Davidson and Indian.

The ages of these machines range from 1911 through 1972.

Sure to draw attention will be three Harley Davidson Knuckleheads, notable for being Harley's first successful overhead valve V-twin engine and given the name by riders who thought the engine looked like fists with two knuckles sticking out.


You can find all of this rolling history and more in the Antique Motorcycle display located in Expo Center.

In Memoriam - Charles "Chuck" Vernon



SoCal AMCA is saddened by the loss of one of our founding fathers. On October 6, 2015, Charles "Chuck" Vernon died at home at the age if 95. Chuck just plain ole used his physical body up. His son Tom Vernon shared with us that he had been sleeping the majority if the time the past few months, and did so when his son took him out for a car ride two days before his passing. Respecting Chuck's wishes, the family had a quiet graveside ceremony.

Message from Tom: ''My father passed away yesterday after a significant decline in his health this year. I know that he was loved and respected by many of the members of our Club and the larger motorcycle community. Please pass along the family's appreciation of the kind sentiment we have received.''

Chuck Vernon was a founding father of the SoCal Chapter of the AMCA, which was started in 1963 and became the seventh chapter to receive a charter in 1972. Chuck was the president numerous times along with Max Bubeck, Gary Breylinger, John Eagles and many other motorcycle leaders. Chuck was responsible for the annual La Mirada Swap Meet and Show, which later became the El Camino Swap Meet. The El Camino Swap Meet was the example used by past AMCA President Bob McClean to start the Chief Blackhawk Chapter's Davenport Swap Meet in Iowa, the concept for the National swap meets. Chuck's knowledge base on motorcycles was immense and yet just a small part of his vast ability and knowledge base. Chuck was an icon in the antique motorcycle world. He will be missed by all. God Speed Chuck. We know you are united with your loving wife in the best place of all.
