Minutes of the General Meeting December 1, 2018

The meeting was called to order at 1:04 p.m. by President, Mark Loewen. There were 23 members total in attendance. There were no guests at the meeting. Membership total is as of 12/1/2018 = 128

Minutes: The minutes of the last meeting were approved as written.

Treasurer's Report: Marie Moore reports the overall financial status of the Club is in good order.

Old Business:

- Club Ride(s): 1.) The Fort Sutter November 17th Club ride included riding in the 16th annual Toy Run organized by Renegade Classics in Sacramento. Riders registered at the Renegades Retail store located on Folsom Blvd. Sacramento and rode to Thunder Valley Casino in Lincoln bringing an unwrapped toy to be provided to underprivileged children in the Sacramento Community. Tracy Stahlman, Ride Captain reported that \$5.00 per rider will be donated to help displaced survivors of the Camp Fire in Butte County. 2.) The December ride, will be held on Saturday, December 8th and is a Toy Run benefiting Nevada County underprivileged children and families.
- Cal Expo: President Mark Loewen reports there were 24 motorcycles on display at this years Sacramento Auto Show. Each year Fort Sutter is invited to display their antique motorcycles and have club members there to answer questions and showcase these older motorcycles. Thank you to all volunteers and members who came out and helped at this years event.
- Fort Sutter receives thank you letters: The Ronald McDonald House Charities of Northern California and Shriners Hospitals for Children sent a personal thank you letter for the club's contribution of \$250.00 each. Each year Fort Sutter will be contributing to worthwhile charities and request club members to recommend another charity for consideration in 2019.
- Camp Fire Devastation & Ishi Chapter: The devastating fire in Paradise is California's largest wild fire. The AMCA Ishi Chapter, representing Chico, Paradise and surrounding areas, experienced first hand the devastation with seven member's homes in Paradise completely destroyed by the Camp Fire. Fort Sutter has reached out to Bud Schwabb, Ishi Chapter President, to offer help. A GoFundMe donation was discussed and a motion was made by Mark Wiebens to donate \$1000 dollars to the Ishi Chapter GoFundMe account. The motion was seconded by Greg Wood. Fort Sutter will also keep in close contact and provide any additional help as needed.

New Business:

- The 2019 Sacramento Autorama: AMCA Fort Sutter Chapter has been contacted and asked to participate by displaying Antique motorcycles at show to be held on February 15-17, 2019. The Club will be given \$300.00 to help offset costs to attend the event. The Sacramento Autorama features a display of products such as hot rods, custom cars, motorcycles, spare parts, accessories, and more. A motion was made by Mark Wiebens to have Fort Sutter attend the 2019 event. The motion was seconded by Greg Wood. Similar to the Sac Auto Show where thousands of visitors will be in attendance over a three day period. A signup sheet was developed and circulated around the room for members who are interested in bringing their motorcycles for display and help with staffing the three day event.
- Fort Sutter Annual Banquet: The annual banquet will be held on Saturday February 23, 2019. Location for this years event is the Iron Grill Restaurant located at 2422 13th Street, Sacramento. The air was crisp when the riders arrived at the Renegade Classics store in Sacramento early Saturday morning. The crowd was growing and growing as everyone arrived to register. By 10:30 AM (time to leave for the ride) hundreds of riders were starting their engines eagerly awaiting the start. The route began on Folsom Rd. and onto Hwy 50 – then I5 north - Hwy 99 towards Marysville - then east on Howsley Rd. and finally ending at Thunder Valley Casino in Lincoln. All riders were directed to the parking structure. The registration fee to ride included entries for a limited edition toy run shirt, breakfast, buffet lunch and multiple prize drawings.

December, 2018 Fort Sutter Ride Nevada County Toy Run - Saturday, December 8th








