

Fort Sutter Celebrates the 1st Dixon National Meet – June 2001

On The Cover... At the AMA's Vintage Days West, which was held Last April at Sears Point, the Fort Sutter Chapter, AMCA sponsored a display of ZS Indian motorcycles. We were honored to have been paid a visit by Bill Tuman and Bobby Hill, the original "Indian Wrecking Crew". Before the points system was inaugurated in 1954, the Number One Plate was awarded to the winner of the Springfield Mile. Bobby (on the right) was the National Champion in 1951 and 1.952 and Bill carried the Number One Plate in 1953. During their visit, both Bill and Bobb1, proved to be true gentlemen who are still great ambassadors for our sport, willing to take pictures with, and give autographs to all who asked. We thank you both.











I was asked to write something about our first national meet held at the Dixon Fairgrounds in 2001, 20 years ago. It's weird to write about an event that was 20 years ago, but even more strange that I wasn't there.



Looking through newsletters, photos, and programs from the event was not only a step back in time, but I got to put names to faces I've only heard about but never got to meet. The meet was shadowed by the passing of Armando Magri on April 20th, just prior to the Dixon meet. We have endured the same type of loss with the passing of Marie Moore earlier this year.

The show itself went well. There were several field meet events on the grass where contestants

showed off their skills as a rider, placing straws in bottles, rings on cones, and hanging clothespins, all while in motion. 34 machines were judged with 1senior, 23 junior firsts and 2 junior seconds awarded. There were several speakers, seminars, a barbeque, and served 125 at the banquet. There were 72 vendors, the local Boy Scouts assisted in parking and the Dixon High School baseball

team sold ice cream from a Cushman 3 wheel vending cycle. The National sent President Bob McClean, National Chief Judge Peter Heintz and National Treasurer Peter Gagan to check out our meet.

From what I've read and seen in photos, the event went well and was received by others very positively. The theme was celebrating the 100th anniversary of Indian motorcycles. Almost a dozen

awards were given to Indians that dated from 1902-1951.

Our chapter dates back to 1932. We became part of the AMCA in 1982. The biggest and most important part of Fort Sutter is the members and their contributions and support. Photos show that active members in 2001 included "Shorty" Thompkins, who passed away in September after the meet at 80 years old, Jack Gormley, Bud Catlett, Rich Ostrander, Jim Moore, Rich Hardmeyer, Mark Milton, Gary Kubodera, Carl Grone, Dick Crawford, and Tom Green. I'm sure there are others and I apologize if I overlooked you.



I bring this up because it's the members dedication to Fort Sutter that makes us shine and stand out of the crowd. These same people are talked about as much today as they were 20 years ago. It's members like these that keep the club up and running. Here's to another 20 years! Even though out 20th anniversary at Dixon was cancelled, we will motor on. We will get past this and will have a get together (another meet) in June 2021. I can't wait to read about our events in another 20 years. Remember don't hide them, ride them!



Jack also served as President and Vice President for the Fort Sutter Chapter. He performed many duties during his tenure. For Dixon's National Show & Swap Meet he was responsible for securing the Club Awards and show "pins", as well as, helping when and where needed. Jack passed away in 2011.
